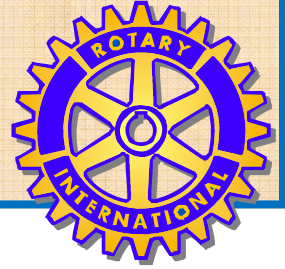

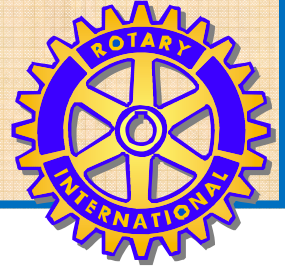
And for our weekly sing-a-long, Lynn chose an uplifting, "Smile Sing A Song".
